





Nevada and Northeast California Recently Burned Areas



Recently burned areas are displayed for the Nevada and northeast California sub-region, including BLM and Forest Service lands. Data show areas that burned between 2001 and 2011. Land managers use fire history information in effects

analysis, assessing trends, and budget planning. Historic perimeters are used in assessing the effects of wildfire on vegetation and in the assessment of risk to communities, which can be used to assess effects on sage-grouse and their habitats.
