**PUBLIC SCOPING REPORT ADDENDUM
FEBRUARY 2013**

SUMMARY

Due to the subject matter of one letter, it was inadvertently filed with the wild horse form letters. However, upon additional review it was determined that the comment letter contains unique comments. This additional letter contained 1 non-substantial comment, and 4 substantial comments pertaining to comment Issue Number 8: Wild Horses and Burros, which are listed in the Addendum to Table C-12 below. With the addition of this unique comment letter, the revised total number of comments is 1,696, the total for planning issue comments is 1,216, and the total for Wild Horse and Burro comments is 299. The revised total of individual commenters is 251, and the total for commenters from an unknown location is 69.

Addendum to Table C-12 Wild Horses and Burros

Are there any plans for there to be more humane handling and transparency with regard to wild horses before, during and after they are rounded up?

Can you be transparent and do you have an estimate on how many have gone to slaughter in the past two decades?

The use of PZP was supposed to significantly reduce roundups, yet it does not seem there has been much decrease in the numbers of wild horses being removed..

It does not make sense for millions of acres to be available and the horses not be allowed to run on it. There is no way around it~ It would cost LESS to supplement their hay if left in the wild than to put them in dry dirt or urine soaked mud lots and feed them. It makes no sense to keep animals in this manner.
