
Greater Sage-grouse Distribution within the BLM and FS Sage-grouse Planning Regions



The distribution of the greater sage-grouse (*Centrocercus urophasianus*) was researched and compiled by Dr. Michael A. Schroeder, research biologist for the Washington State Department of Fish and Wildlife. The distribution was determined using numerous state-specific maps to create a map of sage-grouse distribution for North America in 1999.

Data was modified by BLM experts in 2006 and 2011 to reflect changes in current distribution. Gunnison sage-grouse data, the bi-state population, Washington state, and Canadian greater sage-grouse data are not displayed on this map.
