The Greater Sage Grouse is truly an endangered species. The Grouse's population has declined by 97 percent due to fragmentation and destruction of its sage shrubland habitat by development, grazing, resource extraction and other human impacts. The US Fish and Wildlife Service has recommended that the Greater Sage Grouse be protected under the Endangered Species Act.

More recently, the rapid spread of hydraulic fracturing threatens to place unsustainable pressure on the viability of the Grouse. Recent requests by some local and state officials to keep the Grouse off the Endangered Species List raise special concern, as they seem to be acting to promote rapid exploitation of shale oil and gas resources. Some propose local "public-private partnerships" to manage lands the grouse inhabits. However, some of the 'partners' stand to profit heavily from an estimated \$34 billion in potentially exploitable resources that lie under prime grouse habitat.

Many in the West cherish the Sage Grouse and all of the native wildlife that depend on sage habitat a very special place to live and visit. Tourism supports our economies and will continue to do so if we preserve unblemished landscapes, healthy habitats and vibrant wildlife populations. Moreover, extinction is a growing crisis on the planet. Only decisive action by national governments can forestall the long-term damage that short-term exploitation at the local level will cause if left to narrowly focused economic interests.

I urge you to act on behalf of the Greater Sage Grouse. Please use every tool at your disposal to protect this species from sliding into extinction. Protect Greater Sage Grouse and the sage shrubland habitat upon which the Grouse depends with Endangered Species listing.
