



BSWI Areas of Critical Environmental Concern Update

(Posted March 2016)

The BLM has received inquiries about the number of **Areas of Critical Environmental Concern** (ACECs) analyzed in the *Areas of Critical Environmental Concern: Report on the Application of the Relevance and Importance Criteria*, released in April 2015.

This report analyzed both **existing** and **nominated** ACECs for the BLM's Bering Sea-Western Interior Resource Management Plan (RMP). The report notes eleven existing ACECs and sixteen ACEC nominations, for a total of 27 ACECs.

However, two ACECs—the Kateel River ACEC and the Gisasa River ACEC— had shared acreages between the existing as well as nominated areas, so the BLM combined the analysis for these rivers. Therefore, the ACEC report analyzed 25 ACECs to determine if these areas met the **relevance and importance criteria** necessary for designation as Areas of Critical Environmental Concern.

The report found that **sixteen ACECs** met BOTH the relevance and importance criteria. These sixteen ACECs will be carried forward into the range of alternatives for the Draft RMP where it will be determined whether any special management attention to protect the identified relevant and important values is required and if so, at what scale (acreage).
