APPENDIX E. NOXIOUS WEEDS IN UTAH

The following weeds are hereby officially designated and published as noxious for the State of Utah, via the authority vested in the Commissioner of Agriculture and Food under Section 4-17-3, Utah Noxious Weed Act.

There are hereby designated three classes of noxious weeds in the state: Class A (Control) Class B (Containment), and Class C (Containment).

Class A: Early Detection Rapid Response Declared noxious weeds not native to the State of Utah that pose a serious threat to the state and should be considered as a very high priority.

Class C: (Containment) Declared noxious weeds not native to the State of Utah that are widely spread but pose a threat to the agriculture industry and agricultural products with a focus on stopping expansion.

*Bermudagrass (*Cynodon dactylon*) shall not be a noxious weed in Washington County and shall not be subject to provision of the Utah Noxious Weed Law within the boundaries of that county. It shall be a noxious weed throughout all other areas of the State of Utah and shall be subject to the laws therein.
