Dear Interested Public:

This letter is to provide you additional information related to the Big Willow Packard's Milkvetch Management Environmental Assessment (EA) #DOI-BLM-ID-B010-2011-0048-EA, as referenced by three decisions, and a Finding of No Significant Impact. Two final decisions relating to off-highway vehicle (OHV) trail designations, vegetation treatments, and fencing are being issued. A proposed decision would amend the Cascade Resource Management Plan by modifying OHV area designations in the 7,336-acre area addressed by the EA. Right of Protest and/or Appeal

The final decisions may be appealed to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of the Secretary, in accordance with the regulations contained in 43 CFR Part 4. Public notification of this decision will be considered to have occurred on July 1, 2013. Within 30 days of this decision notification, a notice of appeal must be filed in the office of the authorized officer at *Bureau of Land Management, Boise District Office, 3948 Development Ave., Boise, ID 83705*. If a statement of reasons for the appeal is not included with the notice, it must be filed with the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of Hearings and Appeals, U.S. Department of the Interior, 801 North Quincy St., Suite 300, Arlington, VA 22203 within 30 days after the notice of appeal is filed with the authorized officer.

If you wish to file a petition for stay pursuant to 43 CFR Part 4.21 (b), the petition for stay should accompany your notice of appeal and shall show sufficient justification based on the following standards:

- 1) The relative harm to the parties if the stay is granted or denied,
- 2) The likelihood of the appellant's success on the merits,
- 3) The likelihood of irreparable harm to the appellant or resources if the stay is not granted, and
- 4) Whether the public interest favors granting the stay.

If a petition for stay is submitted with the notice of appeal, a copy of the notice of appeal and petition for stay must be served on each party named in the decision from which the appeal is taken, and with the IBLA at the same time it is filed with the authorized officer.

A copy of the notice of appeal, any statement of reasons and all pertinent documents must be served on each adverse party named in the decision from which the appeal is taken and on the Boise Field Solicitors Office, *U.S. Department of the Interior, University Plaza, 960 Broadway Avenue, Suite 400, Boise, Idaho 83706* not later than 15 days after filing the document with the authorized officer and/or IBLA.

The proposed decision is subject to a 30-day protest period. Please see the administrative remedies section of the proposed decision for information on how to file a protest.
