A. Background

Proposed Action Title/Type: McConnico-Area AML Closures

Location of Proposed Action: Up to 20 abandoned mine workings located on public lands in T. 20 N., R. 17 W., Gila & Salt River Meridian, southwest of Kingman, Mohave County, Arizona. See attached maps.

Description of Proposed Action: The BLM would close up to 20 abandoned mine workings on public lands in the vicinity of McConnico, Mohave County, Arizona. Closing these dangerous abandoned mine workings will prevent accidental falls and the contamination of soil and groundwater by dumping of hazardous materials. BLM biologists have surveyed each working for wildlife habitat and provided a recommendation for closure based on the results. The workings will be closed using the recommended method of backfill or grate. If owls, or any other wildlife, are discovered, they will be expelled before closure. All mining claimants with claims in the area have been notified of this work. No objections to the closures were received by the BLM Kingman Field Office. All mine features are adjacent to existing roads; therefore no new roads to access the features will be necessary.

The objective is to reduce hazards to the public and natural resources on public lands from toxic materials.”*

C: Compliance with NEPA:

The Proposed Action is categorically excluded from further documentation under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) in accordance with 516 DM 11.9: *Appendix 4, J (8) – Installation of minor devices to protect human life, (e.g., grates across mines), and, Appendix 4, J (10) -- Removal of structures and materials of no historical value, such as abandoned automobiles, fences, and buildings, including those built in trespass and reclamation of the site when little or no surface disturbance is involved.*

This categorical exclusion is appropriate in this situation because there are no extraordinary circumstances potentially having effects that may significantly affect the environment. The proposed action has been reviewed (See Attachment 1 - Scoping Form), and none of the extraordinary circumstances described in 516 DM2 apply.

I considered the terms and conditions under which this would be issued and these would result in no significant impacts to the human environment.

Extraordinary Circumstances	Comment (Yes or No with supporting Rationale)
1. Have significant effects on public health or safety.	No. Closing abandoned mine workings will have a positive effect on public health & safety. Accidental injury or death due to falls into the openings will be eliminated. Contamination of soil and groundwater by the dumping of hazardous materials into abandoned mine shafts will be prevented.

No. The proposed action will not have significant impacts on any of the listed. Cultural clearances have been completed for the sites and no historic features would be impacted by the closing. The area is previously disturbed. Any new disturbance will be limited to the minimum necessary to backfill the holes and material for backfill will come from waste rock dumps only.
3. Have highly controversial environmental effects or involve unresolved conflicts concerning alternative uses of available resources [NEPA Section 102(2)(E)].	No. Mining claimants have been notified of the proposed closures, and no objections were made. The area is often used by the railroad and various utility companies. The proposed action will not have significant effects on their activities.
4. Have highly uncertain and potentially significant environmental effects or involve unique or unknown environmental risks.	No. The proposed action will not have highly uncertain and potentially significant environmental effects or involve unique or unknown environmental risks.
5. Establishes a precedent for future action or represents a decision in principle about future actions with significant environmental effects.	No. The approval of this proposed action will not set the precedent for other actions. All other closures will be evaluated individually.
6. Have a direct relationship to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant environmental effects.	No. This action doesn't have cumulatively significant actions in consideration of other actions in the vicinity.






McConnellino Mines

McConnell-Area AML Backfills






**McConnico Mines
