Commercial filming activities in the

Beaver Creek Wild and Scenic River Corridor

Decision: It is my decision to authorize commercial filming activities on public lands within the Beaver Creek Wild and Scenic River Corridor of Alaska. These lands are located in sections 26, 34 and 35 of Township 11 North, Range 4 East, Fairbanks Meridian and within section 3 of Township 10 North, Range 4 East, Fairbanks Meridian.

Rationale: The proposed action is consistent with the use of public lands under the authority of Section 302 of the Federal Land Policy Management Act, the regulations found in 43 CFR 2920 and Public Law 106-206.

The environmental effects of this action were considered in DOI-BLM-AK-F020-2015-0004-CX and were found to have no significant impacts, thus a Categorical Exclusion has been completed and an environmental impact statement is not required.

There are no anticipated impacts to cultural resources. The proposed action will not significantly restrict subsistence uses. There are no expected effects to Essential Fish Habitat.

Appeal Provisions:

This decision may be appealed to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of Hearings and Appeals, in accordance with 43 CFR Part 4 and DOI Form 1842-1. The notice of appeal must be filed with the Bureau of Land Management, Eastern Interior Field Office, 1150 University Avenue, Fairbanks, Alaska 99709-3844 within 30 days from receipt of this decision. Appeals from administrative decisions issued by BLM-Alaska must be filed in writing in the office of the deciding official, either by mail or hand delivery. Notices of appeal transmitted by electronic means, such as facsimile or e-mail will not be accepted as timely filed.
