


Haines MP7 Unauthorized Dump and Shooting Area Location Map



Mt Ripinski Trail boardwalk.

Constructed of 2"x12" treated lumber. Asphalt roof shingles have been nailed to the deck for traction. Boardwalk is 2' wide and about 300' long. Support beams consist of 4-foot lengths of 2"x12" and 4"x4" treated lumber laid at right angles to the deck every 4 to 8 feet. At each end of the beams 1 to 2 foot lengths of partially submerged stacked treated lumber serve as piers.
