NOTICE OF PROPOSED DECISION

Background

Anthony and Betty Jean Martinez applied for grazing privileges for this allotment and the BLM found them to be qualified applicants therefore their application was accepted.

In 2014 and 2015 the Worland Field Office completed a rangeland health assessment on the allotment to determine if the rangeland health standards and guidelines for livestock management were being met. It was determined that the acres within the allotment are meeting standards. Pertaining to the guidelines for livestock grazing, there is no current permit for use on the allotments and has not been for approximately 10 years so the current range conditions could not be associated to an active grazing permit.

Subsequently, the Worland Field Office prepared an environmental assessment (EA) specific to this allotment titled: Murdoch Allotment #17741. EA number DOI-BLM-WY-R010-2015-0033-EA, New grazing permit. The purpose of this action is to analyze the issuance of new grazing permit for the above mentioned allotment within the Worland Field Office with appropriate terms and conditions to promote rangeland health (based upon potential of site). The purpose of this EA is to determine the amount of permitted use based on current resource conditions, season of use, type of livestock, and under what terms and conditions would be applied to grazing management for the grazing permits.

The need for this action is BLM's responsibility to issue grazing permits in accordance with the provisions of the Taylor Grazing Act, Federal Land Policy and Management Act, Public Rangelands

Improvement Act, Administrative Procedures Act, Worland Resource Management Plan (WRMP 2015) and the grazing regulations 43 CFR 4100.

The following decision is based upon that EA.

My Proposed Decision, pursuant to 43 Code of Federal Regulations 4160.1(a) and in accordance with 43 CFR 4130.2, as well as Worland Field Office Policy, is to issue a grazing permit (enclosure 1) to Anthony and Betty Jean Martinez analyzed as the Proposed Decision within the Environmental Assessment (enclosure 2). The grazing permit will be issued as follows:

Provision for Protest and Appeal

Any applicant, permittee, lessee or other interested public may protest a proposed decision under Sec. 43 CFR 4160.1 and 4160.2, in person or in writing to Worland Field Manager, Bureau of Land Management, 101 S. 23rd Street, Worland, Wyoming 82401 within 15 days after receipt of such decision. The protest, if filed, should clearly and concisely state the reason(s) as to why the proposed decision is in error.

In accordance with 43 CFR 4160.3 (a), in the absence of a protest, the proposed decision will become the final decision of the authorized officer without further notice unless otherwise provided in the proposed decision.

In accordance with 43 CFR 4160.3 (b) upon a timely filing of a protest, after a review of protests received and other information pertinent to the case, the authorized officer shall issue a final decision.

Any applicant, permittee, lessee or other person whose interest is adversely affected by the final decision may file an appeal in accordance with 43 CFR 4.470 and 43 CFR 4160.3 and 4160 .4. The appeal must be filed within 30 days following receipt of the final decision, or within 30 days after the date the proposed decision becomes final. The appeal may be accompanied by a petition for a stay of the decision in accordance with 43 CFR 4.471 and 4.479, pending final determination on appeal. The appeal and petition for a stay must be filed in the office of the authorized officer, as noted above. The person/party must also serve a copy of the appeal on any person named [43 CFR 4.421(h)] in the decision and the Office of the Solicitor, 755 Parfet Street Suite 151, Lakewood, CO. 80215. The BLM does not accept appeals by facsimile or email.

The appeal shall state the reasons, clearly and concisely, why the appellant thinks the final decision is in error and otherwise complies with the provisions of 43 CFR 4.470.

Should you wish to file a petition for a stay, see 43 CFR 4.471 (a) and (b). In accordance with 43 CFR 4.471(c), a petition for a stay must show sufficient justification based on the following standards:

- (1) The relative harm to the parties if the stay is granted or denied.
- (2) The likelihood of the appellant's success on the merits.
- (3) The likelihood of immediate and irreparable harm if the stay is not granted, and
- (4) Whether the public interest favors granting the stay.

As noted above, the petition for stay must be filed in the office of the authorized officer and serviced in accordance with 43 CFR 4.473. Any person named in the decision from which an appeal is taken (other than the appellant) who wishes to file a response to the petition for a stay may file with the Hearings division a motion to intervene in the appeal, together with the response, within 10 days after receiving the petition. Within 15 days after filing the motion to intervene and response, the person must serve copies on the appellant, the Office of the Solicitor and any other person named in the decision (43 CFR 4.472(b)).

Please review the Grazing Permit and if you accept the terms and conditions, sign and date the Grazing Permit and return to this office within 45 days after receiving it. An approved copy will be returned to you for your records.
