

A. Background

Description of Proposed Action:

Amending the location of the hydraulic cattle guard from the Holland Reservoir location to Whisker Reservoir. The reason for moving the location is the style of cattle guard would not allow proper turning radius for vehicles with trailers. It was determined that a traditional cattle guard would better serve the public. Since we already have the cattle guard we will look at installing it at Whisker Reservoir where the road is straighter.

Installation of hydraulic cattle guard, no digging would be needed, the cattle guards sit on top of the ground so only minimal leveling surface disturbance should occur. Some minor fence modification may occur to allow for the cattle guard and a gate would remain for livestock access.

The proposed action has been reviewed and none of the extraordinary circumstances described in 43 CFR 46.215 apply. This categorical exclusion is appropriate in this situation because there are no extraordinary circumstances potentially having significant effects on the environment.

Explanation of why there is no potential for significant impacts:

Cattle trespass has become an issue due to fishermen and other public using the reservoirs leaving gates open thus allowing cattle to enter the enclosure.

The cattle guards sit on top of the ground so only minimal leveling surface disturbance should occur. Some minor fence modification may occur to allow for the cattle guard.

While noxious weeds have the potential to be found in the project area the timing and season of work will limit any negative impacts from any noxious weeds encountered. No further analysis is warranted.
