Description of Proposed Action and any applicable mitigation measures

Matt Benotsch on behalf of Eugene Disc Golf Club is proposing to host a disc golf event on January 30, 2016 from approximately 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The activity involved would be disc golf play on established course. As part of this proposal Mr. Benotsch has submitted a Special Recreation Permit (SRP) application, along with signed SRP stipulations which explain all fees and requirements associated with the proposed activity. The expected number of participants is approximately 50 youth and adults. Participants will play disc golf on the disc golf course. There will be minimal set up for this event as it will utilize the existing disc golf course. Participants will have the opportunity to donate to the local Food for Lane County organization during the day's activity.

Land Use Plan (LUP) Conformance

The proposed action is in conformance with the applicable LUP because it is specifically provided for in the following LUP decisions: Page 21- Final Environmental Impact Statement, West Eugene Wetlands Resource Management Plan (2015) **Goal 4 – Provide recreation opportunities**. Under the Federal Land Policy and Management Act, the BLM manages public lands for outdoor recreation use. Substantial recreation infrastructure has already been developed in the planning area and continued support and maintenance of that infrastructure would continue to provide recreation opportunities. Pages 72 and 73 - Increase levels and types of recreation uses that contribute to meeting recreational demand and quality visitor experiences.

Compliance with NEPA

The Proposed Action is categorically excluded from further documentation under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) in accordance with 516 DM 11.9, H (1): *Issuance of Special Recreation Permits for day use or overnight use up to 14 consecutive nights; that impacts no more than 3 staging area acres; and/ or for recreational travel along roads, trails, or in areas authorized in a land use plan.*

This categorical exclusion is appropriate in this situation because there are no extraordinary circumstances potentially having effects that may significantly affect the environment. The proposed action has been reviewed, and none of the extraordinary circumstances described in 516 DM 11.9 apply.

Decision
