Public Meeting on Recreation in the Mount Hood-Sandy River Corridor

Salem, Ore. -- The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will host an open house on the new recreation development and management plans for the Sandy Ridge Trailhead, Wildwood Recreation Site, and Marmot Recreation Area (the former Marmot Dam site). Projects under these new plans will provide additional recreation opportunities and enhance recreation experiences within the larger Mount Hood-Sandy River Corridor.

Early in the planning process for projects in the area the BLM wants to hear from visitors and stakeholders. The meeting will be held on June 8, 2016, from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. at the City of Sandy Community Center (2nd floor), located at 38348 Pioneer Boulevard, in Sandy, Ore.

The BLM manages more than 245 million acres of public land, the most of any Federal agency. This land, known as the National System of Public Lands, is primarily located in 12 Western states, including Alaska. The BLM also administers 700 million acres of sub-surface mineral estate throughout the nation. The BLM's mission is to manage and conserve the public lands for the use and enjoyment of present and future generations under our mandate of multiple-use and sustained yield. In Fiscal Year 2015, the BLM generated \$4.1 billion in receipts from activities occurring on public lands.
