Decision

It is my decision to implement this action on BLM lands as described in the Surveyor Blowdown Salvage categorical exclusion documentation #DOI-BLM-ORWA-L040-2016-0011-EA.

Land Use Plan Conformance

The proposed action is in conformance with the 1995 Klamath Falls Resource Area Resource Management Plan. The actions will comply with the Endangered Species Act, the Native American Religious Freedom Act, cultural resource management laws and regulations, and Executive Order 12898 (Environmental Justice). This decision will not have any adverse effects to energy development, production, supply and/or distribution (per Executive Order 13212).

Decision Rationale

The proposed action has been reviewed by the KFRA interdisciplinary team of resource specialists and appropriate Project Design Features as specified, will be incorporated into the proposal. Based on the NEPA Categorical Exclusion Review, I have determined that the proposed action involves no significant impact to the human environment and no further analysis is required.

Administrative Remedies

The forest management decision to be made on the action described in the Surveyor Blowdown Salvage categorical exclusion is subject to protest under 43 CFR subpart 5003. Under 43 CFR 5003.2 subsection (a), a notice of decision will be published in local newspaper(s). Notification of this decision will be published on **July 6, 2016** in the Herald and News newspaper and on BLM's ePlanning website:

Under 43 CFR 5003.3 subsection (a), protests may be filed with the authorized officer within 15 days of the publication date of the notice of the Decision. 43 CFR § 5003.3 subsection (b) states: "Protests shall be filed with the authorized officer and shall contain a written statement of reasons for protesting the decision." This precludes the acceptance of electronic mail (email) or facsimile (fax) protests. Only written and signed hard copies of protests that are delivered to the Klamath Falls BLM office will be accepted. The protest must clearly and concisely state which portion or element of the decision is being protested and the reasons why the decision is believed to be in error.
