Decision:

I have reviewed this Determination of NEPA Adequacy (DNA) and the Jack Sparrow Supplemental 1 POD Environmental Assessment (EA) (WY-030-09-EA-243), including the analysis and discussion of any potentially significant environmental impacts. I have determined that the Proposed Action, construction of roads, well pads, utility corridors, and the drilling of 5 natural gas wells, will not lead to any new significant impacts not previously addressed in the Atlantic Rim Natural Gas Development Project Environmental Impact Statement (AREIS) and the Record of Decision (ROD), approved March 23, 2007. It is my decision to select the Proposed Action.

Rationale for Decision:

The Proposed Action meets the standards and direction of the various guiding laws, regulations, and directives that apply, including the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (43 USC 35). The Proposed Action meets the decisions from, and is in conformance with, the Rawlins Resource Management Plan (RMP) and ROD approved on December 24, 2008, as amended. Adoption of the Proposed Action will allow the operator to develop their fluid mineral leases as identified in the EA and the AREIS and ROD.

Mitigation Measures/Remarks:

This project will be implemented with all Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), Best Management Practices (BMPs), and project design features as described and/or referenced in the EA. No mitigation measures were identified.

All required SOPs, BMPs, and design features are part of the Proposed Action and can be located in the Application for Permit to Drill (APD), Surface Use Plan (SUP), and Conditions of Approval (COAs) for the individual natural gas wells.

Compliance and Monitoring:


Bureau of Land Management (BLM) personnel will monitor and review operations, as needed, to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of each APD, SUP, and COAs.

Appeal:

Under BLM regulation this decision is subject to administrative review in accordance with 43 CFR Part 4. Any request for administrative review of the decision must include all supporting documentation. Such a request must be filed in writing with the State Director, Bureau of Land Management, P.O. Box 1828, Cheyenne, Wyoming 82003 within 20 business days of the date the decision is received, or considered to have been received.

Any party who is adversely affected by the State Director's decision may appeal that decision to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, as provided in 43 CFR Part 4.
