Royalties for export coal should be paid on the price received at the place the coal is mined, not at the port. This will properly reflect the costs associated with transportation and trans loading coal exports

Example:
Port Price - Port charges - Transportation = ^{mine price} Mine
\$60/ton - \$12/ton - \$25/ton = \$23/ton
