<b>UT-S-160</b>	<b>CONTROLLED SURFACE USE – VISUAL RESOURCES - VRM II</b> Within VRM II areas, surface disturbing activities will comply with BLM Manual Handbook 8431-1 to retain the existing character of the landscape. <b>Exception:</b> Recognized utility corridors are exempt. Temporary exceedance may be allowed during initial development phases. <b>Modification:</b> None <b>Waiver:</b> None

<b>UT-LN-65</b>	<b>OLD SPANISH TRAIL</b> The lessee/operator is given notice that lands in this lease are within two miles of the Old Spanish Trail National Historic Trail [Old Spanish Trail Recognition Act of 2002, (Old Spanish Trail PLO 107-325)]. Modifications to the Surface Use Plan of Operations may be required to protect the historic integrity of the Trail, its resources, its values – such as landscape view sheds, and outdoor recreational opportunities associated with the foregoing.

Prior to development of the lease, the BLM may coordinate with the National Park Service and conduct viewshed analyses if warranted. Modifications to the Surface Use Plan of Operations may be required to minimize the impact to the setting or scenic value from the site(s) of concern.</p>
